

## Parador de Merida



### The Parador:

This beautiful white-walled former convent was built on the site of an ancient Roman temple, and indeed the town of Mérida contains the most important Roman remains in the whole of Spain, earning it its status as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The town was founded by the Emperor Augustus in 25 BC as *Emerita Augusta* (the origin of the modern name), and became the capital of the Roman province of Lusitania. The Roman buildings still visible include a triumphal arch, an aqueduct, two bridges and a theatre, where festivals of Greek and Roman drama are held every July.

#### Arriving by car:

The Parador is located in the centre of the town. Mérida is 60 km from Badajoz and 350 km from Madrid along the main N-V road, and 70 km from Cáceres and 200 km from Sevilla on the N-630.

#### Arriving by train:

Merida train station is located approximately a 10 minutes' walk away from the Parador, but you can also order a taxi to reach it.
