

Parador de Olite



The Parador:

The Parador de Olite, conveniently located between Pamplona and Zaragoza, occupies a wing of a castle-palace built in the early 14th century as a summer residence by King Charles III of Navarre, known as 'Charles the Noble'. The exterior of the building features many towers, battlements and Gothic windows, and the medieval atmosphere is maintained in the interior, with archways, stained glass, wooden furniture, armour, wrought-iron chandeliers and richly coloured wall hangings.

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Directions

Arriving by car:

The Parador Príncipe de Viana backs on to the palace-castle which has been declared a National Monument. On the banks of the river Cidacos, strategically located on the plains, Olite is situated 5 km from Tafalla, and the main access route is the main N-121 road.

Arriving by train:

A walk of just over 5 minutes will take you from the train station to the Parador, via Calle de la Estación and Calle Rúa de San Francisco.
